Meet fellow participants, communicate with program staff, get program announcements, and share your experiences, resources, and ideas with this wonderful, growing community!

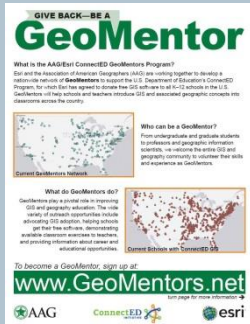
